ORDER DEADLINE - MAY 31, 2016

Dear Members,

Sadly this is the first year in many that Mary Koonce's name does not appear at the end of this introductory note. However I have worked with Mary on the bulb order for several years so, hopefully, her knowledge and experience are still reflected throughout the 2016 list. I think she would have liked the Triple Play Collection named in her memory. Mary and I shared the philosophy that the Bulbs Order's success was to be measured not only by the funds raised to cover our ever increasing show costs, but also by how well it helped members, in a convenient way, to beautify their gardens, achieve success at the shows and share with friends. I hope this is evident in the WDS Bulb Order for 2016.

Times-are-a-changing in our sources for good bulbs. John Gibson no longer ships overseas, and the cost of phyto inspection, shipping costs and customs duties have made it uneconomic to buy from some others. On the positive side, it is a great relief to see that Dutch growers are multiplying a goodly number of the better Mitsch/Havens varieties (i.e. American Dream), and another supplier (Choice Bulbs) has initiated overseas shipments using a very cost-effective system. So, overall, things are looking up.

This year, we have four new offerings from Bob Spotts. There are also bulbs from John Reed (Oakwood Daffodils) who was exceptionally generous with extra bulbs last year. Ringhaddy (Nial Watson), Quality Daffodils (Ron Scamp) and Brent and Becky (Heath) have again been particularly helpful, joined this year by Choice Bulbs (Frankie Charlton). The strong U.S. Dollar has also contributed to overall lower prices, so I think you will find it an opportune time to augment your collection or to help someone new get started.

You can help us all in two ways. First, please indicate definitely whether you are willing to accept substitutes or not, so we don't have to guess. Second, since a number of the bulbs on our list this year are available only in limited quantities, it will be to everybody's advantage for you to order early so that we can put a hold on these with the suppliers, also reducing the need for substitutions.

To order from this list, you must be a member of WDS or belong to a garden club with a current WDS membership. Orders may be picked up at the Fall Meeting (date and time to be announced in the June Newsletter) or mailed to you. If you plan to attend the WDS, MDS or Tuscarora fall meetings, please **DO NOT ADD POSTAGE**. We will make arrangements for your bulbs to be available for you at these meetings.

ALL BULBS ARE OFFERED SUBJECT TO CROP. Prices on imports include air mail and inspection fees. We reserve the right to make substitutions for bulbs in the collections, but we do try to avoid that if at all possible. Any complaint as to the quality of bulbs should be made in writing to either Bob or Karen by Dec 31, 2016.

Explanation of classification and color coding: the number is one of 13 Royal Horticulture Society divisions -- 1 is trumpet, 2 is large cup, etc. The letters indicate color; perianth color follows the division number, and the cup color beginning at the eye is shown after the hyphen. (Y = yellow, G = green, O = orange, P = pink, R = red.) The name of the originator and date of registration follow. Blooming time is signified as E = early, M = mid-season, and L = late.

Was a standard of excellence in its time, Gold in 2014, 78 descendants. Ceylon x seedling		
Reverse Bi-Color:	Inca 6YYW-WWY E Mitsch, 1979	\$5.00
Broad, evenly spaced petals reflex at just the right angle. Lovely, glistening little fellow deserves much more recognition.		
White:	Ashland 2W-W M Pannill, 1994	\$6.50
Big, long lasting flower with excellent form.		
Jonquil:	Limequilla 7W-W M/L Havens, 1989	\$4.50
Beautiful. Ivory/white flower with limey tinge. Seed parent of many. Lime chiffon x n. jonquilla		
Pink Cup:	Burt House 2W-P M Duncan, 2009	\$7.50
The corona is an attractive shade of coral pink and it perfectly balances this symmetrical flower. One of the best, a screaming bargain! Naivasha x Eastern Promise		
Split-Corona:	Bon Viveur 11b W-WWP L Duncan, 2003	\$6.50
Very attractive flower, exceptionally smooth for Div 11, with lovely soft pink rim. A winner. Savoir Faire x Party Time		
Duncan:	Queen's Guard 1W-Y E/M Duncan, 1997	\$11.00
Big, smooth flower, consistent winner.		
Downunder:	Modulux 2 W-Y M/L Phillips, 1978	\$4.50
Dependable, consistent producer of glistening blooms-one of our best values		
Red Cup:	Red Mission 2 Y-R M Brogden, 1988	\$4.00
Relatively unnoticed thus far, one of the exceptionally smooth Y-O/R's bred in New Zealand. Another good value.		
Bob's Bet:	Polgooth 2W-WWP L Scamp, 2004	\$15.00
Heretofore, the name (a village in Wales) and the price turned me off. Now affordable, it has perhaps the neatest rim in its class and has been a consistent winner in the U.K. Quiet Day x seedling

Overall greenish tinge and prominent green eye offset by intense orange rim. Viridiflorus ancestry

Two to five very smooth florets with bowl-shaped corona. Very fragrant. henriquesii x asturiensis	
Calaveras Gold 7 Y-Y E/M 2011	\$20.00
Floriferous, up to 6 florets. (n. jonquilla x n. j. henriquesii) o.p.	
Mesa Verde 12 G-GGY E/M 2001	\$25.00
This is the famous one. It was the Pannill winner last year. The perianth (there are 1 to 3 smooth florets) opens green and becomes a soft, green-suffused yellow. The cup retains much of the green, with a distinct golden rim. Ashmore x (Grace Note x n. viridiflorus).	

Mary's Triple Play Collection: \$10.00

Mary Koonce valued cultivars which could be entered in more than one exhibition section. She was also instrumental in establishing the Parent/Child Class which is now named in her memory. The three outstanding cultivars in this collection are eligible for open classes or in the classic section. A third potential entry is the Parent/Child collection, since they are prolific parents of many, including some in this and other recent WDS Bulb Orders (check them out on Daffseek.org).

Verona 3W-W M/L Richardson, 1958 (68 descendants, including Smooth Sails, Vera Robbins and Halley's Comet, all in this list)

Altruist 3O-R L Board, 1965 (59 descendants including Bossa Nova)

Aircastle 3W-Y L Mitsch, 1958 (85 descendants, including Earthlight and Treble Two)

Foundation/Blue Ribbon Collection: \$ 12.00

Five of these flowers have again been Best-in-Show in 2014 or 2015 despite their age. (This year is the golden anniversary of Tahiti's registration!) All are arguably must-haves, at modest cost.

Very big winner in the U.K., quite possibly best in its class. Dunley Hall x Moon Shadow

Fencourt Jewel 8W-P M Hall, 2008 \$15.00
Coveted by many, now available for the first time at a reasonable price.

American Gold 1Y-Y E/M Reed, 2009 \$12.00
Tall, smooth and well posed; one of the outstanding results of Celtic Gold x Dream Prince cross, a step up in this class.

Mighty Mite 1YYG-Y E/M Reed, 2012	\$32.00
Another Celtic Gold x Dream Prince smoothie, grows at intermediate size and may be the best in its class.	
Firefighter 3Y-R E/M Watson, 2012	\$16.00
Smooth and consistent show flower with rich colors inherited from parent Ulster Bank. Gold Ribbon winner.	
Oh Wow 3W-P M Watson, 2013	\$18.00
The wow factor is the disc-shaped corona in two shades of pink, darker toward the rim.	
Outer Rim 1W-W M Wier, 2015	\$10.00
New 1W-W's are scarce. This one is outstanding for pure white color. Was in a winning Throckmorton at Livermore this year.	
Golden Echo 7WWY-Y M Heath, 2014	3 for \$7.00
This Wister winner has unusually smooth (for Div 7) perianth and a unique color code. Ballygarvey x n. jonquilla	
Minnowlet 11a Y-Y M Pesterfield, 2010	\$6.00
The light lemon yellow perianth measures just under 70mm, so this is a true intermediate, but with Minnow's shorter stems. A cutie! An imaginative cross: Minnow x Baccarat
